The Bible is divided into the Old Testament and the New Testament.

God told Abraham about a covenant, or agreement he wanted to make, in which Abraham was to become the father of many nations. Abraham accepted this Covenant from God.

Abraham, Sarah, and Isaac were the ancestors of a people known as the Hebrews. The story of Salvation on earth begins with Abraham. He is considered a holy person by the religions of Judaism, Christianity, and Islam.

The Old Testament has 46 books and contains stories that are important to Jews, Christians, and Muslims. These stories tell of God's people before the time of Jesus.
